## THE MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Looking at my diary, it's three months since I wrote my previous Mayor's Message and I realise that I am two thirds of the way through my term of office.

In October the financial planning for the 23/24 budget began and the councillors and council officers began to work out what the next financial year will look like.

Further details of our 23/24 budget are included in this publication and on our website.

The 5 November being a Saturday, meant that the annual fireworks display could be held on the actual day and not somewhere near it. A great display on the St John Field (which was once again sponsored by Mercedes – thank you) was attended by well over 10,000 people, and, from their reactions on leaving the site; thoroughly enjoyed. Thank you to all our staff and volunteers who worked hard to make it such a success.

On Armistice Day, a short ceremony was held at 11am, when children from Brackley schools assembled at the War Memorial to remember the fallen, particularly those from Brackley.

The full Remembrance Day ceremony was carried out on Sunday 13 November when the people of Brackley came together in commemoration of those who suffered and died in conflicts that seem to have been continuous since 1945. Remembrance Day is always a sombre experience, reminding us every year of those who put themselves in harm's way in defence of other people and their wellbeing and the effect it has on everyone, particularly those left behind. Those of us who have soldiered know the cost of war on our comrades and their relatives.

As always, We Will Remember Them.

On 17 November I was delighted to attend a performance of The Pirates of Penzance produced by Nick Planas at Egerton Hall. A band of young musicians conducted by Nick played for an excellent cast of singers and resulted in a delightful performance that was greatly enjoyed by the capacity audience. Thank you, Nick and everyone who took part.

As the build up to Christmas began it was a pleasure to look in at the lantern making workshops held in the Old Fire Station Community Room where youngsters were making the lanterns they would be carrying at the procession prior to the switch on of the Brackley Christmas Lights. I was really impressed at the artistic ingenuity of the lantern makers, not being of an artistic nature myself I can still recognise it in others and see the pleasure they have in it.

Saturday 26 November was a busy day starting off with the planting of a tree from the Queen's Living Tree at the Jubilee celebrations in the open space at Rose Drive. The Living Tree, consisting of young trees and saplings was distributed across the UK to be planted as part of the Queen's Canopy of Trees campaign. Northamptonshire received four trees, one of which was presented to Brackley in recognition of the efforts of 5th Brackley Scouts in their planting and nurturing of trees in Brackley. They were well represented at the planting ceremony

which was attended by Morcea Walker, the Vice Lord Lieutenant of Northamptonshire and Paul Parsons, representing the Queen's Canopy and the scouts were proud to be honoured for their efforts.

Quickly changing footwear, we then went to Waynflete Infants School to open their Christmas Bazaar and enjoy a good browse among the various stalls. An excellent attendance at a well organised event which was greatly enjoyed by all the pupils, parents and friends who attended.

After that there was time for a quick meal and then down to the St John field for the lantern procession leading to the switch on of the Christmas lights. Once again, many thanks to all who attended - the lights looked magnificent as usual.

The next day I was at Skate Sunday, a skateboard training event organised by South Northants Youth Engagement to get young skaters ready for the long-awaited arrival of the Brackley Skate Park, which we hope to bring you further news on very soon.

I had great pleasure in opening the Christmas Bazaar at Brackley Care Home and somehow found myself singing with the Brackley Male Voice Choir. It must have been the mulled wine as normally I keep a discreet silence except in large crowds, my singing voice being rather raucous. However, generosity and Christmas spirit prevailed and on-one complained. Elaine and I attended the WI carol service at Brackley Methodist Church in December and I was able to hide my voice in a larger congregation.

The third last event of the year was the Tractor Run around Brackley in aid of the Yellow Wellies charity. A total of 64 decorated tractors and four other vehicles including the Brackley fire tender toured the town to the delight of a lot of people spread all around Brackley to see the show.

The penultimate event of the year was the Carol Service outside the Town Hall with Brackley Band providing the music, Waynflete Lodge offering mulled wine and town councillors and staff handing out hot chocolate. Bad weather and a football final limited attendance this year, but, people had a thoroughly enjoyable evening with the Rev Rich offering a blessing to mark the meaning of Christmas as celebrated by the Christian Church.

The final event of 2022 was the Classic Car Show held on the Market Place, car park and High Street on the Tuesday after Christmas. This event was organised, as before by, Cllr Chris Cartmell and the team from the August show. A good attendance of interesting cars and drivers made an excellent break between Christmas and New Year.

I started this message wondering how I was going to write enough but I seem to have succeeded so I finish here and since it will be February before you see my efforts, wish you all a belated Happy New Year.

## Let's talk about the budget...

The Town Council is required by law to prepare a budget in order to calculate its precept requirement. The budget must give details of planned expenditure for the financial year ensuring that financial resources are aligned to the priorities of the Council. The Town Council is keen to provide local services for Brackley residents as your first tier of Local Government.

Brackley Town Council owns and manages a wide range of facilities and services on behalf of the community including the Town Hall, Old Fire Station, Egerton Hall, public toilets, open spaces, parks and playgrounds. For a full list please see our website www.brackleynorthants-tc.gov.uk.

This coming year is expected to bring additional pressures as caution remains from the impact of the cost of living and in particular the rising costs in energy, fuel and food. As a result of this, we have been carefully reviewing the impact of the economic difficulties in the setting of the 2023/24 budget.

The figures relating to the Town Council's 2023 budget are shown overleaf to a total of £1,233,635.

# Where does the £1,233,635 Brackley Town Council budget come from?

## What is the precept?

The precept is the Town Council's share of the council tax. It is collected on our behalf by West Northamptonshire Council and fills the gap between the Town Council's planned expenditure and its estimated income. Town Council do not receive any direct funding from central government and so the precept is a hugely important part of a Town Council's income.



## HEDGE LAYING PROJECT

From mid-January, the Brackley Town Council estates team will be restoring and laying around 100 metres of hedge at St James Lake. This is part of a CPRE grant funded project to help improve biodiversity in the town and create long lasting hedges which will provide a habitat for a wide range of wild life.

The project will start with a hedge laying course for some of our estates team and volunteers. In earnest, we are keen to involve the community so skills can be passed on and further areas of hedge can be restored in the coming years.

If you would like to get involved in this hedge laying project, we will be working during various week days and plan to run weekend sessions as well.

The restoration will involve laying the existing hedge by thinning out excess growth and replanting any gaps with new hedging plants.

Laying hedges promotes growth in the lower parts of the hedge which then provides a diverse habitat for a wide range of wildlife and allows wild flowers to flourish.

We will also be creating 100m of new hedge which again in time will improve much needed habitats and biodiversity.

We are keen to get as many people involved in this project from all age groups and abilities. There are many jobs which you can help with big or small.

## RECYCLE WITH THE RADSTONE

We are the Year 6 class of The Radstone Primary School. Our school is opposite Poppyfields Park and our classroom overlooks the whole park. This park calls people to play with the fantastic equipment for children of all ages but one day we realised that there were no recycling bins in the park! We wanted to change this so we decided to take action. We contacted Brackley Town Council and were lucky enough to have Mark Stopps, Operations Manager come in to school to answer our questions. To our suprise, we learnt that the Town Council had already tried putting recycling bins in to the park but they weren't used properly – things that couldn't be recycled ended up in the recycling bins. We didn't realise this was a problem, but Mark explained that one piece of general waste in a recycling lorry means that none of the contents of the lorry can be recycled!

## WHAT'S GOING TO CHANGE?

We have persuaded the Town Council to give Brackley another chance and put a recycling bin back into Poppyfields Park! This will be unveiled in the spring. To keep this bin, we all need to use it well and put the right rubbish in the right bin.

3Bs Radio are a community-based Radio Station based at The University of Buckingham, broadcasting to Brackley, Buckingham, Bicester and the surrounding areas.

The station launched in October with a number of local presenters providing a mix of shows and content tailored to the area. As part of the stations output, we provide live commentary of Brackley Town FC matches both home and away across the network.

3Bs Radio is an internet-based station, which is available online and also on the Amazon Alexa smart speaker. We are looking to be listed on other smart speakers as well and have also applied to be on DAB as part of the submissions of NOxDab and BucksDAB to OFCOM.

The presenters provide a variety of music, chat and local news across various shows. During the evenings a number of shows showcase different genres of music such as soul, rock, progressive rock, world music, northern soul and disco, covering songs from the 60s all the way to the present day.

## A NEW ACTIVITY FOR A NEW YEAR? JOIN THE BRACKLEY MORRIS MEN...

The Brackley Morris Men have a long colourful history and are always delighted to welcome newcomers to help preserve this ancient piece of our local heritage.

This year, 2023, marks the four hundredth anniversary of their earliest record. It's a solid silver communion plate presented to the parish in 1623 by seven men understood to have been the Morris Men. Their names and the date 1623 are inscribed on the plate. The plate is still kept safely in St Peters Church to prevent further wear and tear but is brought out on special occasions and re-presented by the current side to mark their continued association with the Church.

Their spiritual home remains in the heart of Brackley. They hold weekly practices in the Town Hall and have regular performances on Brackley Market Place, including at midday on Boxing Day and at 5.30am on May Day morning. They also perform throughout the year at fetes, festivals and other celebrations both in Brackley and further afield.

Newcomers are always welcome. No cost, no commitment, just a chance to try it for yourself. Music and dance works wonder for your mental & physical wellbeing, so why not go along to the Town Hall at 8.00pm on Thursday evenings to see what it's all about.
