Playing for just a few minutes has been shown to boost your mood. The physical stimulation of drumming and the vibrations that resonate through every cell in the body stimulate the release of negative emotions. Drumming as a group is inclusive; it is for everyone.

This is why Accent Percussion has been set up; with the aim of helping people improve their mental



health and their general wellbeing. Being part of a group helps each other, provides social interaction, companionship and support.

We meet on Tuesday evenings, 5pm-6.30pm, at Egerton Hall. A session is just £5.00 per person (places are limited). You can dip in and out, there is no pressure to do anything you don't want to do.

CHATTY CAFÉ SCHEME

The Chatty Café Scheme, launched in 2017, helps reduce loneliness via the use of Chatter & Natter tables. Designating a

few tables in a café, pub or community centre creates a space for people to connect, have conversations and meet new people. The sessions are supported by Chatty Café volunteers, welcoming people to the table and helping to create a friendly atmosphere.

Jon Haslam, a Brackley resident, approached Richard Rainbow, the owner of The Lounge Café Bar, about collaborating with the scheme to provide the setting for a weekly warm and welcoming Chatter & Natter table. Jon's positive nature has led to the concept being warmly embraced by the people of Brackley and it has gone from strength to strength.

Following incredible local support, the Chatty Café has expanded across Brackley and is currently running a daytime group every Thursday from 3pm – 5pm and an evening session every Wednesday from 6pm – 8pm, both at The Lounge Café Bar. Earlier this year, Brackley Town Council provided a grant to cover the cost of hot drinks, ensuring those who might be struggling financially could still benefit from attending.

The Chatty Café volunteers, together with some of the regulars, even take the Chatty Café on tour, regularly visiting Brackley Care Home to spend time and connect with the residents! Along with 6 month and 1 year anniversary celebrations, the group also enjoyed a very well attended Christmas meal to celebrate the incredible success.

There is plenty of capacity for more people to come along and we would warmly encourage you to join either a daytime or evening group (or both!) at The Lounge Café Bar, Brackley in order to meet new people, feel happier and better connected to others.

Let's talk about the budget...

The overall expenditure is £1,314,288, of which £1,053,664 comes from Council tax in the Annual Precept. As with most councils and businesses, administration is the biggest cost – this covers a wide range of matters such as staffing, IT and infrastructure, legal, audit and insurance costs, training and so on. The Town Council has decided to focus on environmental maintenance, public services such as toilets and cemetery, events and venues. The Council does not deal with housing, highways, social care and benefits. To find out more about Brackley Town Council please visit our website.

What does it cost per average household (Band D)?

Annual cost per household from 1 April 2024:

- £177.04 yearly
- £3.40 weekly

An increase of £7.34 per year / 14p per week for each household.

The below data reflects the 2024/25 expenditure budget agreed by the Council and the cost per household refers to a Band D house which totals £177.04 per year, an increase from last year of £7.34. The Council employs 13 people and serves around 18,000 residents making it one of the largest parishes in West Northamptonshire. There are 16 elected councillors who are unpaid volunteers.



SNVB; the heart of community volunteering



Our award-winning local charity is the hub of community volunteering across Brackley, Towcester and surrounding villages.

Rachel Page has been presented with Northamptonshire Community Foundation's 'Northamptonshire Rose of the Shires' Award for her commitment to community action through the Brackley Area Volunteer Car Service, and for many more activities to which she donates her time.



SNVB Community Food Larders (Towcester and Roade) achieved Silver in the Weetabix Sustainability Awards; an accolade that shows the substantial impact made by over 100 volunteers to a service that reaches over 1000 people per week and saves 3 tonnes of food from waste each month.

SNVB was also invited to attend the launch of the Coronation Food Project, attended by Their Majesties King Charles III and Queen Camilla. Representatives from SNVB met His Majesty and we are so grateful to our friends at SOFEA and FareShare for inviting us to this event.

Our current campaign is to secure a long future for Garden Buddies; a project that has, for 10 years, been a 'lifeline that's

so much more than mowing'. Our volunteers bring social contact and a welcome smile to our clients, many of whom are socially isolated and vulnerable. The project has also become a source of business volunteering opportunities and is a wonderful avenue for community action.

Last year we generated over £300K of volunteering value through our Social Action Projects. We know that in addition to these numbers, it is the warmth of interactions, the smiles raised, and the atmosphere of a place that truly makes a difference to the people who use our services, and to our volunteers who spread joy to the people we serve.
