Welcome new investment in our roads

Cllr Phil Larratt, Cabinet Member for Environment, Transport, Highways and Waste

An additional £2.86m is being invested in our roads in the year ahead, allowing our partners West Northamptonshire Highways to accelerate maintenance and repair works across the area.

The additional investment includes £1m from our council, plus an extra £1.86 million from the Government.

We also continue to work with Kier to deliver a multimillion-pound plan to maintain our road network through the Community Enhancement Plan.

This work has reached over 161 parishes, clearing nearly 4km of vegetation and cleaning more than 1,500 road signs to date. Alongside this, Kier has also rectified over 1,688 road and footpath defects, and 6,771 carriageway repairs.



We are committed to working with Kier to manage the Highways network across the area better. We have a planned programme of works to repair our roads, and we will always do our best to act on reports of potholes.

In addition to the £1 million boost we're investing into our planned programme; we welcome the additional Government investment. We know theres is a vast amount of work to do to improve the state of the roads across West Northamptonshire, but this is a step in the right direction.

West Northants to benefit from £5.4m fund

New cycleways will be created and local businesses and voluntary organisations are set to benefit from more than £5.4million funding from the Government's UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF).

The funding is the largest allocation in the South East Midlands and will be used to create pride in place, improve people's life chances, increase skills, create stronger communities and support local businesses over the next 2 years.

Our plans for the funding include creating new and improved pedestrian crossing facilities between the Billing Road and Abington, in Northampton, and improving paths and cycleways to encourage active travel.

The funding will also be used to tackle fuel poverty and the cost of living through the provision of a range of services across West Northants, including improving Household Energy performance in people's homes.

Local voluntary and community organisations will also receive a portion of the money to help increase engagement in community centres and improve the support available to residents.

A range of initiatives, including a new grants programme to help local businesses at all stages to start, sustain, grow and innovate and tailored employment support to help people into work, will also receive some of the funding.

Other areas planned to benefit include:

- Funding for volunteer and social action projects
- Decarbonisation and improving the natural environment
- Business support to enable employers to better utilise the local workforce and understand the advantages of being flexible in terms of recruitment.

We have worked closely with stakeholders, community groups and local partners to analyse the greatest needs for this funding, and most importantly, to deliver economic prosperity in our area whilst supporting sustainability, increasing employment opportunities and offering greater support for local businesses.

Multiply courses set to boost adult numeracy

A range of free adult numeracy courses have been launched by our Council to help people brush up on their maths skills and become more confident with numbers.

The courses, known as Multiply, are designed to make maths simpler for everyone, and to show that even those who struggled with maths in school can feel confident with numeracy in their day-to-day lives.

Launched as <u>part of the government's UK Shared Prosperity Fund programme</u>, Multiply includes numeracy courses for beginners through to more advanced offers such as GCSE Maths and Level 2 Functional Skills Qualifications. People can take a short quiz to understand which areas of numeracy they might want to improve by visiting the <u>Skills for Life website</u>.

Multiply forms part of almost £575k allocated to help improve adult numeracy in the area by the Department for Education in partnership with WNC.

Through Multiply, we want to boost people's confidence and ability to use maths and numbers effectively in daily life, at home and work. This includes helping people attain a formal qualification to open doors to new jobs, career progression and further study.

Vouchers to support families over half term

Families with schoolchildren experiencing hardship across West Northamptonshire will receive a voucher to support them with food costs during the May half-term holiday.

Our Council will be distributing over £187,000 in vouchers provided by the Department for Work and Pensions to help up to 12,500 of the most vulnerable families with the ongoing cost of living challenges.



Schools and those who are home educated have been contacted about the plans to issue the £15 (per week and per student) vouchers ahead of the half-term break, from the week beginning 22 May. They can be used in supermarkets and must be used by the redeem date given.

We know that the school vouchers issued previously have been a true support for many families during these difficult times, so we have acted quickly to ensure they will be available again for those who need them ahead of this May half-term break.

The vouchers are the first step towards distributing £5,199,257 that has been allocated to the Council by the DWP in the fourth round of its Household Support Fund (HSF4).

Our Cabinet will meet on 13 June to determine the best use of HSF4 within the scope set out by government over the next 9 months, which will support struggling residents and deliver better outcomes as part of its anti-poverty strategy.

Survey on county's sexual health services

Public Health teams at West and North Northamptonshire Councils are seeking input from residents across Northamptonshire to help shape sexual health services across the county.

Any and all information provided while completing the survey will be kept anonymous, secure and confidential, and will be shared only with the people who run and make decisions on Sexual Health services.

Videos aiming to improve recycling habits

To help ensure that the right stuff, goes in the right bin – we have created a series of videos to help reduce contamination and improve these recycling rates.

Have you ever opened something at home, but not known what to do with the packaging? Or perhaps you're a bit of a wish-cycler – putting things in your recycling bin in the hope they can be recycled?

We all try to do the right thing, but if too much of the wrong stuff goes in the recycling bin, it causes contamination.



Too much contamination in our recycling bins can lead to entire lorry loads being spoiled and disposed of with general waste instead of being recycled into new products.

A key milestone in our sustainability journey

Our Council has reached a key milestone in our journey towards becoming a net zero local authority by achieving our first national environmental accreditation.

Following an independent audit, the Council has earned Bronze Award accreditation with the Investors in the Environment scheme (iiE), recognising its commitment towards sustainability.

The iiE scheme is designed to help organisations improve their environmental performance and reduce their impact on the environment, save time and money as well as get recognition for their progress. Bronze status is the first of three iiE accreditation levels the Council is working towards achieving to ensure environmental excellence.

As members will be aware, our Council is committed to achieving Net Zero for our own emissions by 2030 and Net Zero West Northants emissions by 2045, with the recent publication of our baseline **emissions report** for 2021-22 last month representing a significant step forward in meeting its sustainability goals.



We're delighted to be awarded Bronze iiE Accreditation, recognising our commitment to cutting emissions and meeting our 2030 target to achieve net zero as well as celebrate our achievements so far.

Councils now able to apply for £150m fund

Parish councils are now able to apply to the multi-million-pound Community Ownership Fund.

The Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities has launched the third round of its £150m Community Ownership Fund.

The aim of the fund is to help community projects to save local assets, such as sports clubs, music venues and historic buildings.

The amount of funding all projects can bid for will be increasing from £250,000 to £1m in this third round, and the requirement for match-funding is also being reduced to as low as 10%.

<u>Parish councils will now also be able to apply to the fund</u>, which has previously only been available to charities and community groups.

Venues sought for free Heritage Open Days

Historic buildings, churches and venues across West Northamptonshire will be open to the public for free from Friday 8 to Sunday 17 September, as part of the <u>Heritage</u> Open Days event

The initiative is a once-a-year opportunity for residents to explore some of the area's unique historic buildings and sites, many of which are usually restricted access or charge for entry, finding out about West Northamptonshire's vibrant culture and heritage like never before.

New area planning committees are adopted

Planning applications across West Northamptonshire will be determined by two new committees from June, as our Council continues work to improve planning services.

As Town and Parish Councils will be aware, since Vesting we have operated three Local Area Planning Committees, covering the former Daventry District, South Northants and Northampton Borough areas.

Proposals to abolish those committees, and replace them with two new committees – one covering the north of West Northants, and one for the south – were agreed at Annual Council last week.

These changes form part of our response to the review by the Planning Advisory Service, and seek to ensure that our planning function is effective, reflects good practice and supports our duties.

They will enable us to continue to improve our planning services for residents and partners. We will be able to make decisions more quickly and improve our communications with residents by livestreaming meetings, enabling them to watch from anywhere.

They form part of our wider planned improvements to the planning service, which has already seen us implement a new planning portal for Daventry, Towcester and Brackley areas – with Northampton to follow this summer.

Update on the Planning Portal

We are working hard to resolve an intermittent issue relating to documents for applications determined before 23 March 2023 in the Daventry area.

These documents are not currently available to view online and the team are carrying out a review to determine the cause of the issue and resolve this as guickly as possible

In the meantime, any residents who need to access document(s) from these applications are advised to please email the service on: planning@westnorthants.gov.uk with the application number, site address and details of the document(s). The team will aim to make these documents available within 10 working days of the request.

Access support for neighbourhood planning



Are you planning to develop a Neighbourhood Plan for your town or parish area?

Neighbourhood planning gives communities the opportunity to work together to develop a plan for their area. They contain policies about what communities consider important, where they think development should go and what it should look like.

When they are "made" or adopted, they form part of the development plan and are used in decision making alongside the Part 1 and Part 2 Local Plans for West Northamptonshire, together with other material planning considerations, so they are powerful tools.

New information to help communities understand the process of preparing a neighbourhood plan and to decide whether it is the right approach for them has been published on our website recently.

It includes advice on designating a neighbourhood area, preparing a draft plan, and the process of submission and consultation, together with information about the examination process and the local referendum which all Neighbourhood Plans must go through before they can be 'made', or adopted.

We encourage interested communities to contact us as early as possible, preferably at the point that a steering group is being established, so that we can provide support from the beginning. By contacting us early, we will be able to advise when we will have resources available to support you.

Thousands of people came together to enjoy a Bank Holiday weekend of events and activities as communities across West Northamptonshire celebrated the Coronation.

On Saturday hundreds of people braved the rain for the Community Festival street party in Northampton town centre, with the celebrations continuing in the sunshine on Sunday as over 6,000 people flocked to the Coronation Big Lunch and After Party in the grounds of Northampton's historic Delapré Abbey.



Visitors to the free event were treated to a variety of local performances including StyleStars and Dance with a Difference, Northampton's Pauline Quirke Academy, Similar Jones, Old Savoy Jazz Band, Rock Choir, Djin-Li, Britain's Got Talent semi-finalists Born To Perform and Lucien Moon, who appeared on The X-Factor in 2015 and is opening for Westlife later this summer.

The event, held on a gloriously sunny day which turned into a mild evening, concluded with a live broadcast of the National Coronation Concert on the big screen.



Coronation events also took place at towns and villages across West Northamptonshire, with over 70 street closures taking place as neighbourhoods gathered to stage their own street parties.

I know a lot of Town and Parish Councils held events over the weekend, including getting involved in the Big Help Out on Bank Holiday Monday, which saw people across the country take part in voluntary work to highlight its impact on local communities.

I am sure you will agree it was great to see so many families and communities come together and enjoy a wonderful Coronation weekend.

I would like to say a big thank you to all the organisations who helped to support the Big Lunch and make it such a memorable and enjoyable day for all those who came along.

Partnership can help you put on a safe event

Is your council planning an event this summer? Please ensure you make good use of the Event Safety Partnership (ESP), set up by our Council in consultation with colleagues at the police, fire and rescue and East Midlands Ambulance Service.

The ESP receives applications for events on behalf of all partners and deposits the information on Resilience Direct – a secure repository that blue light services and selected Council colleagues can access.

Our Council has a duty of care to ensure that any events held on our land are compliant with current legislation but above all are safe and legal.

Any event that is not on our land but in the WNC catchment area may still be subject to scrutiny from partners, for example Northamptonshire Fire and Rescue Service and the police joint operation team.

The ESP is also able to advise on anything event related, so groups planning an event can be provided with templates and guidance for event management plans, risk assessments, food safety, inflatables, counter terrorism and more.

We are urging residents across West Northamptonshire to ensure they dispose of batteries safely following a number of fires in our bin lorries and at Household Waste Recycling Centres in recent months.

A new campaign, supported by Northamptonshire Fire & Rescue Service, is urging people to:

- Never put any kind of battery into their wheeled bins
- Use the Council's battery recycling collection, take batteries to supermarkets, or to a HWRC
- Remove all batteries from old electrical or battery powered items before recycling electricals.



As part of the campaign <u>we shared a video of a real incident in which one of our bin lorries</u> caught fire

People can recycle batteries as part of our kerbside collections, so long as they put them in a bag and place them on top of:

- Their blue lidded recycling bin (Northampton residents)
- Black general waste bin (Daventry area residents)
- Either bin (those living in the South Northamptonshire area)
